In 2009 there is plenty to do at **CCW**. Between now and summer these events and activities will be taking place. The **CPWM Retreat** will be here on the weekend of March 6 & 7. The **Junior High Retreat** will be here the weekend of March 13-15. Spring **Work Week** will be the week of April 14-18 with work projects each day. **Camp Clark Williamson Sunday** is on April 19. This is the day set aside by Presbytery in which special offerings are encouraged to be taken by congregations to benefit CCW. An additional **Work Day** is scheduled for May 2.
